FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER'S DESK JUNE 2010

We are entering the dreaded time of the year for those of us who are dedicated to our State and The Shadows as our permanent home. As I have said in the past, please be aware of the subtle signs of dehydration that can lead to more serious health problems. Make certain that you have plenty of water with you if you are outside for any extended length of time. If your lips feel a bit parched, if you are somewhat shaky or unsteady and can't attribute it to any particular condition, then chances are it may represent the first signs of dehydration. Coffee and soda merely make the situation worse. Water, I am told, is the best solution (no pun intended).

By the time you read this, or shortly thereafter, you will have received your annual packet from the administration office. The packet includes your new monthly maintenance Coupon Book together with material from RCI and your Regime. Please read the information included in the packet carefully inasmuch as it contains important information about your community and your individual Regime. I would ask that you please fill out and return the information request form pertaining to your automobiles, license plates and bar codes together with your July maintenance payment. RCI is updating its databases, and it is very important for us to have current and accurate information. Many residents have sold, transferred, abandoned or purchased new automobiles. We have outdated information that will be purged from the databases, and we do not want to delete current information or inadvertently de-activate your bar code. When purchasing a new automobile, many of you gave us a TEMP Arizona plate and never called with the new plate number. We appreciate your time and co-operation in providing current information using the enclosed form. The form contains the word WARNING, at the top of the page.

You will note that maintenance fees have not been increased for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. This is because neither RCI, nor any of the Regimes have found it necessary to increase their respective fees. I would consider this a plus given the state of the economy, and I applaud the various Boards of Directors for their prudent and positive fiscal management.

Some maintenance issues that have been addressed in the past month include the re-recovering of the couches in the Lounge and winged back chair in the Library. The material chosen initially was flawed and the re-covering was performed at no extra charge. In addition, the Gatehouse canopy was redone after it was hit and damaged by a truck. In the next week or so a large canopy at the maintenance office will be installed to provide shade and a more suitable appearance. We are eliminating the two gas carts that make a racket as they travel around the property. They are being replaced with electric carts. In addition, the manner in which some administration office responsibilities are carried out has been rearranged for efficiency and privacy.

Regime I will be embarking on a significant repair of its underground garage sometime during the month of July. In order to shorten the time to completion (approximately three months or more), the entire garage will be closed for the duration of the construction. As a result, the following changes will take place with regard to RCI above-ground parking areas:

1. The recessed parking lot and large parking area on the west side of Building 21 will be available for use by Regime I residents only.

2. The recessed parking lot next to Building 27 (the paint shed is located in the lot), will be permanently closed and used only by RCI for recharging and storing its carts (they must be removed from the Regime I underground). When the carts are returned to their parking spots in Regime I, that lot may then be used for the charging of electric cars by any of our residents who might have purchased such an automobile. The cost of charging such cars will be borne by the resident(s).
3. RCI and Regime I will make every effort to minimize any inconvenience to our residents as a result of this project.

Next in our continuing series of Departments to be Highlighted at The Shadows is the Landscaping Department.

The Landscaping Department is headed by Supervisor Jesus Morphin. There is not much one can say about the efforts of Jesus and his crew other than to just look around the community and appreciate its manicured appearance, the bright colored flowers and the velvet looking golf course. A great deal of knowledge and effort goes into making our home as beautiful as it is, and only a part of this department's responsibilities are visible. The rest occurs behind the scenes or underground where the sprinkler systems, drip systems, water feeds and much maintenance occurs. Jesus has been with The Shadows for many years and his tireless efforts have managed to draw the envy of all those who reside here and those who come to visit. As I have said in the past, this is a little city, and Jesus and the *Red Shirts* (his staff) do a masterful job of making it an enviable and beautiful place to live and visit.

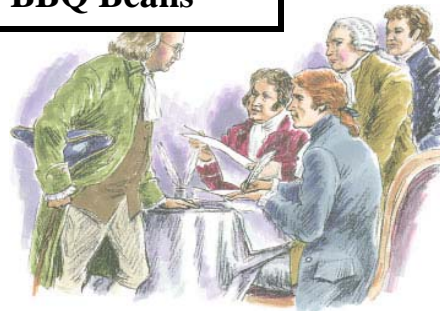
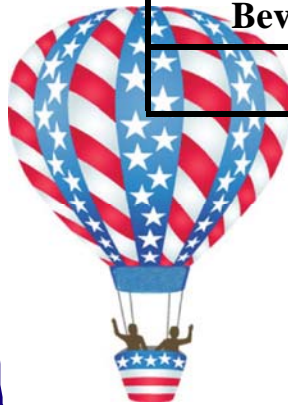

June 4 ***Nine*** running time 119 minutes **PG-13** *Starring:* **Daniel Day-Lewis, Penelope Cruz & Nicole Kidman.** From the creative team behind the Oscar-winning adaptation of Chicago comes a lavish feature take on the Tony award-winning musical inspired by Federico Fellini's whimsical classic 8 1/2. Your monthly maintenance fee is your annual maintenance fee divided by 12 months and this most probably will result in a few cents being added to your monthly amount (since it is no longer rounded off). You are not paying any more than you should.
- You will only receive 1 (one) coupon book for your Unit and any additional garage spots you may own in your Regime. The total amount of the coupon will reflect your monthly maintenance fee for your Unit plus the monthly fee for any additional garage spots you may own in your Regime.
- You will only receive more than one coupon book if:
 - You own a garage spot in a Regime other than in which you own a Unit
 - You own more than one Unit, in which case you will receive a separate coupon book for each Unit owned.
