FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER'S DESK

As I stated in my last newsletter, welcome back to those who escaped our summer heat. From the activity in the past several weeks, it is apparent that many of our co-owners and friends have returned. We hope you can see the improvements that were made while you were away, some of which are obvious, others not. Since this is the November issue, the Staff and I would like to wish you a very Happy Thanksgiving. Remember not to stuff yourself, that's for the turkey.

If you look at our website and the bulletin boards in the buildings and around the complex you will see that our Activities Director has planned a number of activities that are both interesting and fun. We hope you will take advantage of them, or at least choose those that "tickle your fancy". The new sidewalk has been installed on the West side of the complex. It extends from the gatehouse to the Pima room at the Administration building. In addition, the *spillway*, the portion of the trough between the upper lake and middle lake has been torn up and replaced with new concrete. It was in bad shape after so many years of use and will now survive all of us. We have replaced the inoperable TV in the Navajo room with a new flat screen LED TV, and speaker system. This will now provide an additional area for movies and other audio and video events. There are new mats and bulletin boards in both the men's and woman's work out rooms, and a new shelf has been made by Sol (one of our wood elves) in our shop that ties the two book-cases together in the Navajo room, to hold additional equipment that was housed in the old black cabinet.

I would like to thank all of our residents who have contributed to our HOMELESS drive. CASS, to whom all of the clothing and bedding is delivered for distribution to those in need is happy with the early and eager reception of our request for help. There have been a number of residents who believe that our constant slow and continuous repair and upgrade of our property is unnecessary, particularly in this economy. I must tell you that in the past month alone, there have been visitors and former owners who have come into my office to let me know how beautiful and desirable our community is. Two are moving back, after moving out and finding there is nothing like the Shadows, for the price, and several others who were just visiting have expressed their wish to purchase here. In fact, one couple has looked all around our area and further North only to find that there truly is nothing like the Shadows. Sometimes we take what is in front of us for granted, instead of appreciating that we are residing in a resort for less money than it would cost in a newly developed condominium or rental unit, without any of the amenities available to us. Whether you use them or not, there is truly nothing in this area, except in a hotel that offers what we provide for our residents.

Just as a side note, an article written by Paul Messinger in the Friday, October 9th issue of the Scottsdale Republic, (page 39), reveals the following: Mr. Messinger's aunt and uncle, the Williams, owned a great deal of property in this area. The Williams' son and daughter-in-law purchased 40 acres for a farm. They sold it in the early 50's and lo and behold the farm became Scottsdale Shadows.

I would like to let you know that the Board has scheduled a HOMEOWNERS MEETING, in the Lounge for 7:00PM on November 17th. Members of the Board will be present to answer Homeowner's questions and to listen to their comments and suggestions. This IS NOT a Board meeting but a Homeowners Meeting to give all of our residents an opportunity to bring to the attention of the Board, issues of importance to all of us. Please note, however that this is an RCI and not a Regime Homeowner's meeting and so the only issues that the RCI Board will be able to address are those relating to RCI. 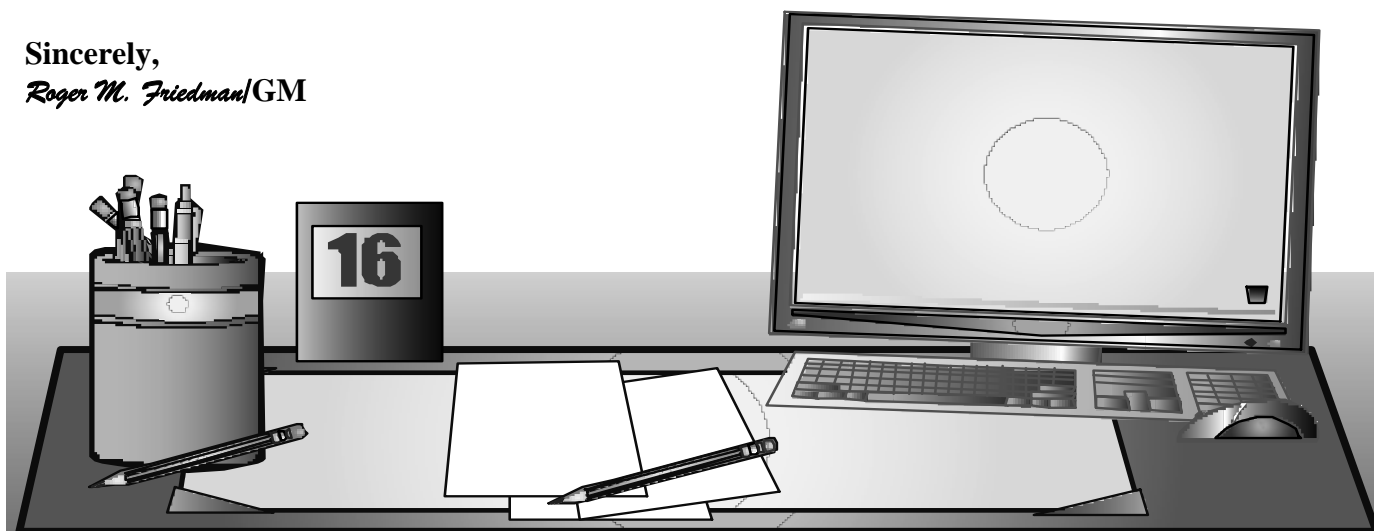
OF NOTE

Please remember that there are a number of things you can do as an Owner/Tenant-resident to protect your investment in the Shadows and to insulate yourself against personal liability for injury or damage to your property or to others or their property. If you are an Owner CARRY A POLICY OF HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE, and if a Tenant, a TENANT'S POLICY. In addition, it is recommended that you leave a set of keys at the gatehouse (in case of emergency) and if you choose not to do so, at least leave a key with a neighbor friend and notify the gate and my office who holds same. In an emergency, physical or mechanical, it is much better for the staff to be able to enter easily, instead of either forcing entry or calling a locksmith. In either of those cases, precious moments are lost in awaiting entry.

Finally, please remember that any issue that you may have that is directly related to a Regime (the building in which you reside) must be brought to the attention of the President, Administrator or other member of the Regime Board. RCI does not have authority to intervene in Regime business or make decisions affecting a Regime, except in case of an emergency.

You will be receiving a letter shortly reminding you of the EMPLOYEE HOLIDAY FUND. If you wish to make a donation, it goes into a special Fund account for distribution during the Christmas Holiday to all employees. I do not participate in this distribution. Please remember to take advantage of the activities that are planned. Have a great beginning to the Holiday season. Be Healthy, Happy, and Safe!

November 6 ***My Life In Ruins*** running time 95 minutes **PG-13** Starring: **Nia Vardalos & Richard Dreyfuss.** Georgia came to Greece to follow a man. A few years later, she's been cast aside -- alone and adrift in a foreign land. Eventually, her passion for history leads her to a job as a tour guide. But Georgia is bored, and has lost her "kefi" (Greek for mojo) to boot. When taciturn sasquatch Poupi replaces the regular driver at the last minute, the frazzled tour guide thinks that her luck has just hit rock bottom. Thankfully, Georgia's latest batch of tourists is a more lively bunch than she's anticipated, and in between bouts with rival tour guide Nico, she manages to form a genuine connection with wisecracking widower Irv, a solo vacationer who maintains a jovial facade despite the fact that he misses his late wife dearly. With a little help from Irv, Georgia comes to realize that true love may be closer than she thinks -- if she could just recapture her kefi and open her eyes.

November 13 ***Land Of The Lost*** running time 60 minutes **PG-13** Starring: **Will Ferrell, & Danny R. McBride.** A quantum paleontologist has been discredited in the scientific world due to his strident belief in time travel as the cure for all of humanity's problems. After hitting an all-time low, giving a lecture to elementary school kids, Dr. Marshall meets an ambitious young scientist named Holly, who tells him she has followed all his work and believes he's a genius. Spurred on by her enthusiasm, he finishes building the device that will allow him to time travel -- something he promptly does along with Holly, and white-trash fireworks salesman Will, after Will leads them into a cave that seems like a promising place to test the new machine. They end up in a world full of dinosaurs, sand, and scary lizard-like creatures known as Sleestacks. They quickly lose the machine that brought them to this alternate universe, and if they ever want to return home, the trio must recover it with the help of Chaka, the monkey-like friend they be-friend in this strange place.

November 20 ***The Taking of Pelham 123*** running time 106 minutes **R** Starring: **Denzel Washington & John Travolta.** A New York City subway dispatcher draws on his extensive knowledge of the subway system in order to outsmart a dangerous criminal mastermind who's hijacked a subway train in this remake of the 1974 thriller inspired by John Godey's best-selling book. Walter Garber is drifting through his daily routine when he receives word that a heavily armed gang of four has hijacked a subway train and is holding all of the passengers hostage. Led by cunning master thief Ryder, the gunmen will begin executing everyone aboard should the authorities fail in delivering ten million dollars in the space of just one hour. With the tension in the tunnels rising, Walter races to save the hostages before the shootings start. But through it all, there's one part of Ryder's plan that Walter can't quite comprehend: even if the thieves do succeed in getting their money, how could they possibly get out of the tunnels undetected?
